COLSA was awarded a position on the Veterans Administration, Transformation Twenty-One Total Technology (T4) contract as part of the Bylight small business team. The total contract value is \$12 billion dollars. The T4 contract, which has a performance-period of five years, will provide a broad range of task orders to support the VA's vision to integrate agency systems and modernize its IT infrastructure. COLSA will compete for task orders to provide services including program management; systems and software engineering; enterprise network, test and evaluation; independent verification and validation; cyber security; operation and maintenance services; training; and IT facility support.

The contract provides a total solution to meet the client's mission requirements, including hardware, software, IT products, systems integration, networking, and other IT services.

- Task Orders may include acquisitions of hardware, software, and other products
- Not intended as a mechanism to solely purchase IT products
- Products purchased to the extent necessary to deliver the solution required

Services shall include:

- Technical, systems engineering, and other solutions encompassing the entire range of IT requirements
- Services, and related IT products, may encompass the entire life-cycle of a system
- Services and related products shall be global in reach and the Contractors will provide services and deliverables worldwide.
